# Parents help baby wash hands

[Beginner Level]

### **Dialogue**

Parent: Let's wash your hands before eating.

Parent: We're at the sink now.

Parent: First, let's turn on the water.

Parent: I'll help you wet your hands.

Parent: Now rub, rub, rub with soap—like this.

Parent: Let's rinse off the bubbles.

Parent: Dry with the towel—pat, pat.

Parent: All clean. Now we're ready to eat!

### **Tip for Parents**

### **Dialogue**

Parent: Time to wash hands before lunch.

Parent: Let's turn on the water—just a little.

Parent: I'll help you get your hands wet.

Parent: Let's rinse off all the bubbles.

Parent: Dry your hands with the towel.

Parent: There—we're clean and ready!

### **Tip for Parents**

While still helping physically, shift your language toward prompting—"rub the back too," "now rinse." This gently prepares your toddler for eventual independence.

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# Baby tries to wash hands

### [Beginner Level]

### **Dialogue**

Parent: Let's wash your hands now.

Parent: Can you turn on the water? Just a little.

Parent: Wet your hands—yes, like that!

Parent: Try rubbing with soap—good!

Parent: Don't forget your fingers.

Parent: Rinse the bubbles.

Parent: Now dry your hands.

Parent: Nice work. We're ready to eat!

Parent: Dry your hands well.

Parent: Great job—now you're ready for your meal.

### **Tip for Parents**
